Guving

Todd Grover provided some background on issues he has recently encountered related to guying and 'guy fishes'/'johnny balls' when a new attachee is being brought onto the pole. This particular issue only appears in the 2012 NESC (215C a, b, and c). Corey noted that it has appeared previously in code but became much more stringent starting in 2007. The Committee discussed what OJUA's role/authority in the instances identified by Todd. Todd indicated that he is looking to the OJUA for clarifications and definitions. Chair Barks asked Corey to make a presentation on how Pacific Power deals with and inspects for NESC 215C (related to guying) at a future Committee Meeting. Corey agreed to bring one of her company's engineers in for the presentation

at the Committee's pleasure. Corey will check to see if the engineer is available for the September or November Standards Committee meeting.
