Trifold Update

NESC Change Proposals

The Committee reviewed and discussed the proposed change to Rule 217A2c as submitted by Tillamook PUD regarding an exception for standoff brackets (Exhibit on file).

New Business

The Committee engaged in a lengthy, diverse, enthusiastic discussion regarding the revised NESC Rule 238, relating to grounding/bonding of streetlights on wood poles to allow reduced clearance to communications. The Committee concluded that there appears to be a lack of clarity for developing company standards based on this code. Although a ground rod may not be required, any ground wire on the pole requires bonding to that ground wire.

Stuart Sloan provided notice that he will be proposing a change to Rule 234c3d1 exception 2b at the next meeting.
